The changes have made an impact on the Women of the Moose too.

Unfortunately we are now seeing our membership numbers drop because many women do not understand why what we do as Women of the Moose is important.

Could you imagine telling a child at Mooseheart who loves playing music that the program is being dropped from the curriculum because there is no funding?

And what about our Seniors at Moosehaven? How would not having hearing aids, haircuts, and bicycles impact their lives.

You see, it's these very things that the Women of the Moose provides.

Through our fundraising we are able to fully support the Daily Needs at Moosehaven for things like clothing, newspapers, bicycle repair, eye exams and glasses; hearing tests and devices, regular dental exams, celebrations including Christmas, New Year's Eve, Thanksgiving, and other special activities.

At Mooseheart, the Women of the Moose fund the Feed a Home in

December program where children and teens assist with food budgets, meal preparation and cooking, the Boys and Girls Athletic Program, celebrations including Christmas, New Year's Eve, Thanksgiving, the Music Department, occupational therapy, school photos, and personal items for new students including n clothing, coats, shoes, bedding, photo frames of their family.

And let's not forget the scholarships the Women of the Moose provide to graduating seniors.

Application Fee May 1 — December 31, 2024 to join The Moose online
